


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The Faculty of Engineering and Information Technology Excellence Awards recognise and celebrate the contributions of academic and professional staff.

The scheme provides a mechanism for applicants to build competitive cases for wider University awards, including the <u>University of Melbourne Excellence</u>
Awards, and external award schemes.

Who can apply?

The FEIT Excellence Awards are open to all salaried members of staff (including full and part time, fixed term, casual and continuing) at the University of Melbourne. Each award also has specific eligibility criteria outlined in this guide.

Awards are available for both individuals and teams. Team applications must be led by a FEIT member of staff who is a salaried member of staff (including full and part time, fixed term and continuing) at the time of application (honorary staff are ineligible).

Previous unsuccessful applicants are eligible to reapply.

How to apply

Applications are self-nominated.



1. Explore the Awards

Familiarise yourself with the FEIT Award Guidelines, including eligibility, assessment criteria and supporting materials for the Award/s you intend to apply for (these vary for each Award). Download a copy of the application form from the <u>website</u>.



2. Develop your application

Complete the application form (available on the website) and gather supporting materials.



3. Submit your application

Combine your application form and supporting materials into one single PDF and submit it to engit-engagement@unimelb.edu.au by the due date.

FEIT Excellence Awards Celebration

Winners will be announced at the FEIT Excellence Awards Celebration in June 2024. All Award applicants will be invited to attend the celebration.

Prizes

All successful applicants will receive a certificate.

Award winners currently employed by the University of Melbourne will receive \$1000 e-Mastercard. If a team wins, the value of funds will be distributed evenly amongst the University of Melbourne staff declared within the application. Team members from outside UoM are ineligible to receive a e-Mastercard.

Subject to eligibility, Award winners are expected to nominate for at least one other award in the year following their successful FEIT Excellence Award nomination.

In addition, the winner of the of the FEIT Excellence Award in Teaching – The Kelvin Medal will receive a two-year membership to the Kelvin Club, enjoy a celebratory lunch at the Kelvin Club and be awarded the Kelvin Medal. The Kelvin Club is a city-based gender inclusive association that is free, secular and democratic.

Members of the Kelvin Club encourage strategic alliances that promote academic exchange in Engineering, Economics, and the Arts for social good.

The Kelvin Medal is an annual award that recognises Excellence in the Teaching of engineering and IT, where skills and knowledge are communicated to others. We thank the Kelvin Club for their continued support of the FEIT Excellence Award in Teaching – the Kelvin Medal.



Research Excellence Awards

Recognising outstanding contributions and achievements in research for the Faculty and the University.



1. FEIT Excellence Award in Early Career Research

Recognising the significant research contributions of FEIT's early career researchers.

This award celebrates research that has advanced the standing of engineering or IT. This research contribution must have occurred within five years of the nomination deadline. Activity entered for this Award must have been published in at least one peer-reviewed output (i.e. journal article, book or similar).

Although not mandatory, preference will be given to research conducted at the University of Melbourne.

One award is awarded annually.

Subject to eligibility, Award winners are expected to nominate for at least one other award in an alternate scheme the year following their successful FEIT Excellence Award nomination.

1.1 Eligibility criteria

- Nominations for this award can be individual or team based.
- Applicants should have either less than five years' experience in active research or obtained their PhD within five years of the application deadline.

Individual Entries

• Applicants must be salaried members of staff (including full and part time, fixed term and continuing) of the Faculty of Engineering and Information Technology at the time of nomination (honorary staff are ineligible).

Team Entries

- Team applications must nominate a team leader via the application form.
- The team leader and majority of team members must be eligible FEIT early career applicants and be a salaried member of staff (including full and part time, fixed term and continuing) of the Faculty of Engineering and Information Technology at the time of nomination (honorary staff are ineligible).

1.2 Assessment criteria

Applicant must address three assessment criteria via the application form. Max. 500 words.

1. Originality and Significance

Detail how your research contributes to new insights within its field and/or pioneered a new area of enquiry.

2. Scientific Rigour

Describe the investigative approach undertaken and how you have employed approaches not normally used in your field of research.

3. Impact and Benefit

Demonstrate the extent to which the research:

- influences future Australian and/or global research, and
- leads to a clear impact(s).

1.3 Application requirements

The following information will be captured through the completion of the application form, unless specified below.

Statement on Research Contribution and Impact

The application must provide a statement on the following information regarding the nominated research. **Max. 500 in total.**

Provide an overview of the nominated research contribution. Your statement should address: background, objective/s; results to date; list of outcomes that directly relate to the research (e.g. patents, grants, awards, collaborations). Preference is given to research conducted at the University of Melbourne; if the nominated

research contribution was carried out elsewhere, provide a brief explanation (e.g. institution, has work continued since joining FEIT).

- Provide a list of published peer-reviewed outputs that directly relate to the activity entered. For individual entries
 with multi-authored works, you must state your individual contribution, noting if you are the principal author,
 corresponding author or other. For team entries, each peer-reviewed output must be co-authored by the majority
 of team members.
- Provide a statement of impact regarding up to three research outputs listed. Use independent evidence to
 demonstrate the significant contribution of your output(s) to your field. This may include details regarding the
 quality of the journal or publisher, reviewer quotes, publication sales, details of reprints and subsequent publication
 in other collections.

Statement on Individual or Team Entry

If applying as an individual entrant, explain your reasoning behind this choice. Or, if applying as a team, describe the contribution of each individual and explain why this Award should be jointly awarded. **Max. 300 words.**

2. FEIT Excellence Award in Mid-Career Research

Recognising the significant research contributions of FEIT's Mid-career researchers.

This award celebrates research that has advanced the standing of engineering or IT. This research contribution must have occurred within five years of the nomination deadline. Activity entered for this Award must have been published in at least one peer-reviewed output (i.e. journal article, book or similar).

Although not mandatory, preference will be given to research conducted at the University of Melbourne.

One award is awarded annually.

Subject to eligibility, Award winners are expected to nominate for at least one other award in an alternate scheme the year following their successful FEIT Excellence Award nomination.

2.1 Eligibility criteria

- Nominations for this award can be individual or team based.
- Applicants should have between five and ten years' experience in active research or obtained their PhD between five to ten years from nomination deadline.

Individual Entries

 Applicants must be salaried members of staff (including full and part time, fixed term and continuing) of the Faculty of Engineering and Information Technology at the time of nomination (honorary staff are ineligible).

Team Entries

- Team applications must nominate a team leader via the application form.
- The team leader and majority of team members must be eligible FEIT mid-career applicants and be a salaried member of staff (including full and part time, fixed term and continuing) of the Faculty of Engineering and Information Technology at the time of nomination (honorary staff are ineligible).

2.2 Assessment criteria

Applicant must address three assessment criteria. Max. 500 words.

1. Originality and Significance

Detail how your research contributes to new insights within its field and/or pioneered a new area of enquiry.

2. Scientific Rigour

Describe the investigative approach undertaken and how you have employed approaches not normally used in your field of research.

3. Impact and Benefit

Demonstrate the extent to which the research:

- · influences future Australian and/or global research, and
- leads to a clear impact(s).

2.3 Application requirements

The following information will be captured through the completion of the application form, unless specified below.

Applicant details

Applicant must provide details to determine eligibility.

Statement on Research Contribution and Impact

The application must provide a statement on the following information regarding the nominated research. **Max. 500 in total.**

 Provide an overview of the nominated research contribution. Your statement should address: background, objective/s; results to date; list of outcomes that directly relate to the research (e.g. patents, grants, awards, collaborations). Preference is given to research conducted at the University of Melbourne; if the nominated research contribution was carried out elsewhere, provide a brief explanation (e.g. institution, has work continued since joining FEIT).

- Provide a list of published peer-reviewed outputs that directly relate to the activity entered. For individual entries
 with multi-authored works, you must state your individual contribution, noting if you are the principal author,
 corresponding author or other. For team entries, each peer-reviewed output must be co-authored by the majority
 of team members.

3. FEIT Excellence Award in Research

Recognising outstanding curiosity-driven research.

This award celebrates research that has advanced the standing of engineering or IT. This research contribution must have occurred within five years of the nomination deadline. Activity entered for this Award must have been published in at least one peer-reviewed output (i.e. journal article, book or similar).

Although not mandatory, preference will be given to research conducted at the University of Melbourne.

One award is awarded annually.

Subject to eligibility, Award winners are expected to nominate for at least one other award in an alternate scheme the year following their successful FEIT Excellence Award nomination.

3.1 Eligibility criteria

Nominations for this award can be individual or team based.

Individual Entries

• Applicants must be salaried members of staff (including full and part time, fixed term and continuing) of the Faculty of Engineering and Information Technology at the time of nomination (honorary staff are ineligible).

Team Entries

- Team applications must nominate a team leader via the application form.
- The team leader and majority of team members must be eligible FEIT applicants and be a salaried member of staff (including full and part time, fixed term and continuing) of the Faculty of Engineering and Information Technology at the time of nomination (honorary staff are ineligible).

3.2 Assessment criteria

Applicant must address three assessment criteria. Max. 500 words.

1. Originality and Significance

Detail how the research outcome(s) are ground-breaking, as well as how the research has influenced its field of science and/or pioneered a new area of enquiry.

2. Scientific Rigour

Describe the investigative approach undertaken and identify the research methods employed, outlining the steps taken to ensure a robust and unbiased approach.

3. Impact and Benefit

Outline the potential or actual impact of this research beyond its field of science, as well as any public impact.

3.3 Application requirements

The following information will be captured through the completion of the application form, unless specified below.

Statement on Research Contribution and Impact

The application must provide a statement on the following information regarding the nominated research. **Max. 500 in total.**

- Provide an overview of the nominated research contribution. Your statement should address: background, objective/s; results to date; list of outcomes that directly relate to the research (e.g. patents, grants, awards, collaborations). Preference is given to research conducted at the University of Melbourne; if the nominated research contribution was carried out elsewhere, provide a brief explanation (e.g. institution, has work continued since joining FEIT).
- Provide a list of published peer-reviewed outputs that directly relate to the activity entered. For individual entries with multi-authored works, you must state your individual contribution, noting if you are the principal author,

4. FEIT Excellence Award for Outstanding Graduate Researcher Supervision

Recognising outstanding achievements in supervision and development of the next generation of Australia's scientific researchers.

This award celebrates exemplary practice in research supervision that has made a significant contribution to the development of students.

One award is awarded annually.

Subject to eligibility, Award winners are expected to nominate for at least one other award in an alternate scheme the year following their successful FEIT Excellence Award nomination.

4.1 Eligibility criteria

- Individual nominations only are accepted for this award.
- Applicants must be salaried members of academic staff (including full and part time, fixed term and continuing) of the Faculty of Engineering and Information Technology at the time of nomination (honorary staff are ineligible).
- Applicants must have graduated as least five Graduate Researchers (PhD, professional doctorate and/or Masters by Research) with the majority being enrolled at FEIT.

4.2 Assessment criteria

Applicant must address criteria number one (1) and in addition, may choose to address criteria two (2) and three (3). Max. 500 words.

1. Sustained results in the development of Graduate Researchers (mandatory).

Identify and provide evidence of the extent to which the applicant has achieved sustained results in supervision and development of Graduate Researchers. This may include: supervision practices that lead to research projects and research theses judged by examiners to be of outstanding quality; supervision practices that lead to candidates publishing books, chapters and articles, presenting papers at prestigious conferences, and winning prizes and awards; the engagement of research students in the broader intellectual life of the department, faculty and University; engagement with the end-users of their research, support and encouragement for students to develop as independent researchers; support and encouragement for students to develop the full range of graduate attributes; the induction of students into the national and international research communities in their fields; the mentoring of students in their career development following completion of their graduate research degree.

2. Approaches to supervision that influence, motivate, and inspire students to excel (optional).

Identify activities and programs implemented and supported by the applicant and describe how they have led to the development of Graduate Researchers across FEIT and their respective discipline. This may include: fostering students' development as researchers by stimulating curiosity and independence in learning; contributing to the development of students' critical thinking skills, analytical skills and scholarly values; inspiring and motivating students through high-level communication and interpersonal skills; effective approaches to guidance during the planning of research projects; structures established for ongoing interaction with students.

3. Contribution to the development of excellent supervision practices within FEIT or the wider University (optional).

Describe and provide evidence of the applicant's commitment to community of practice in the supervision and development of Graduate Researchers. This may include: the mentoring of staff new to supervision; involvement in and contribution to supervisor workshops and training; development of School and Department policies and programs to enhance the graduate research community and the quality of the environment for graduate research.

4.3 Application requirements

The following information will be captured through the completion of the application form, unless specified below.

List of Graduate Researchers

Applicants for this award must list at least five, and up to ten, Graduate Researchers (PhD, professional and doctorate and/or Masters by Research) that you have supervised to completion. The majority of Graduate Researchers should have been enrolled at FEIT. Up to three graduated students will be contacted to provide confidential statements on their supervision experience.

Referees

Nominate at least one internal referee, with the option to nominate one additional referee, who may be internal or external to the University. Please note, the panel assessing the application will notify the applicant before contacting external referees.

Curriculum Vitae

A curriculum vitae, a maximum of 2 pages per CV.

Career Interruptions

If you have experienced an interruption that has impacted your academic record, please include a short statement explaining this in your CV.

Supporting Documents (optional)

Applicants may provide supporting material relating to their submission. Max. 5 pages; collate as single PDF.

5. FEIT Excellence Award in Interdisciplinary Research

Recognising outstanding research outcomes enabled through interdisciplinary collaboration.

This award celebrates original research was made possible through interdisciplinary collaboration between both internal and/or external stakeholders from two or more unrelated disciplines. This research contribution must have occurred within five years of the nomination deadline. Activity entered for this Award must have been published in at least one peer-reviewed output (i.e. journal article, book or similar).

One award is awarded annually.

Subject to eligibility, Award winners are expected to nominate for at least one other award in an alternate scheme the year following their successful FEIT Excellence Award nomination.

5.1 Eligibility criteria

- Nominations for this award can be individual or team based. Team nominations can consist of FEIT and non-FEIT researchers, but the project must be led by a FEIT-CI.
- Applicants <u>leading</u> the submission must be salaried members of academic staff (including full and part time, fixed term and continuing) of the Faculty of Engineering and Information Technology at the time of nomination (honorary staff are ineligible).

5.2 Assessment criteria

Applicant must address three assessment criteria. Max. 500 words.

1. Originality and Significance

Detail how the research outcome(s) are ground-breaking, as well as how the research has influenced its field of science and/or pioneered a new area of enquiry.

2. Approach to Research

Identify and describe the research methods adopted to ensure a robust and unbiased approach to research was adopted.

3. Discipline Integration and Research Impact

Describe how the research outcomes were made possible through interdisciplinary collaboration, and how this led to potential or actual research impact on a field(s) of science and/or created public impact.

5.3 Application requirements

The following information will be captured through the completion of the application form, unless specified below.

Statement on Research Contribution and Impact

The application must provide a statement on the following information regarding the nominated research. **Max. 500 in total.**

- Provide an overview of the nominated research contribution. Your statement should address: background, objective/s; results to date; list of outcomes that directly relate to the research (e.g. patents, grants, awards, collaborations). Preference is given to research conducted at the University of Melbourne; if the nominated research contribution was carried out elsewhere, provide a brief explanation (e.g. institution, has work continued since joining FEIT).
- Provide a list of published peer-reviewed outputs that directly relate to the activity entered. For individual entries
 with multi-authored works, you must state your individual contribution, noting if you are the principal author,



Engagement Excellence Awards

Recognising outstanding contributions and achievements in engagement with our partners and the wider community.



6. FEIT Excellence Award in Industry Research

Recognising outstanding research projects undertaken in partnership with industry.

For the purposes of this award, Industry is defined loosely as to include Government bodies, NGOS, Not-for-profits and all types of businesses.

The initiative will have effectively led to sustained research application and collaboration. Innovative projects should demonstrate significant impact and reach in terms of research collaboration and dissemination. Evidence must also be shown of demonstrating the value to users and the wider society.

One award is awarded annually.

Subject to eligibility, Award winners are expected to nominate for at least one other award in an alternate scheme the year following their successful FEIT Excellence Award nomination.

6.1 Eligibility criteria

- Nominations for this award can be individual or team based.
- Applicants must be salaried members of academic staff (including full and part time, fixed term and continuing) of the University of Melbourne at the time of nomination (honorary staff are ineligible).
- Team nominations can consist of FEIT and non-FEIT researchers, but the project must be led by an eligible FEIT-CI.

6.2 Assessment criteria

Nominations should address the following assessment criteria. Max. 500 words.

- 1. Describe innovative research projects that demonstrate significant impact and reach in terms of industry research collaboration and dissemination;
- 2. Demonstrate an established and sustained record of engagement and collaboration with industry; and
- 3. Demonstrate the impact and value created through research engagement for industry.

6.3 Application requirements

The following information will be captured through the completion of the application form, unless specified below.

Statement on Individual or Team Entry

If applying as an individual entrant, explain your reasoning behind this choice. Or, if applying as a team, describe the contribution of each individual and explain why this Award should be jointly awarded. **Max. 300 words**.

Referees

Nominate at least one internal referee, with the option to nominate one additional referee, who may be internal or external to the University. Please note, the panel assessing the application will notify the applicant before contacting external referees.

Curriculum Vitae

A curriculum vitae, a maximum of 2 pages per CV.

For team entries, please collate CVs as a single PDF.

Career Interruptions

If an applicant has experienced an interruption that has impacted on their academic record, please include a short statement explaining this in their CV.

Supporting Documents (optional)

Applicants may provide supporting materials relating to their list of peer-reviewed research output (e.g. reports from referees/reviewers of manuscripts, editor's correspondence and publication reviews). **Max. 5 pages**; collate as single PDF.

7. FEIT Excellence Award in Internationalisation

Recognising outstanding contributions in enhancing FEIT's and the University's international standing.

Initiatives and strategies may include (but are not limited to) international student mobility activities, inbound and outbound student support, alumni engagement programs, internationalisation of the curriculum, and developing international partnerships with institutions, research centres and/or joint collaborators.

The initiative will be successful in enhancing our international brand, partnerships, and relationships with our intentional stakeholders, such as current or aspiring students, alumni, research partners or education institutions.

One award is awarded annually.



9. FEIT Excellence Award in Teaching - The Kelvin Medal

Recognising teaching excellence and approaches to teaching that influence, motivate and inspire students to learn and develop.

The Kelvin Medal represents the Faculty of Engineering and Information Technology Preeminent Teaching Award. The award celebrates substantial and extended contributions to teaching in engineering and/or IT. Activities should include significant, extended, research-informed contribution to excellence in teaching and learning experiences for students in the Faculty, and leadership in engineering or IT teaching.

One award is awarded annually. The successful applicant will receive a two-year membership to the Kelvin Club, enjoy a celebratory lunch at the Kelvin Club and be awarded the Kelvin Medal.

Subject to eligibility, Award winners are expected to nominate for at least one other award in an alternate scheme the year following their successful FEIT Excellence Award nomination.

9.1 Eligibility criteria

- Individual nominations only are accepted for this award.
- Applicants must be a salaried member of academic staff (including full and part time, fixed term and continuing)
 of the Faculty of Engineering and Information Technology at the time of nomination (honorary staff are ineligible).

Outstanding achievements may include contributing to initiatives such as digital or blended learning innovations, approaches to pedagogy and curriculum redesign, development of teaching resources, feedback or assessment initiatives, and developing student citizenship and cohort building.

One award is awarded annually. Subject to eligibility, Award winners are expected to nominate for at least one other award in an alternate scheme the year following their successful FEIT Excellence Award nomination.

10.1 Eligibility criteria

- Individual nominations only are accepted for this award.
- Applicants must be Early Career Academics with less than five years' experience teaching in higher education institutions. This duration is calculated from the point of employment; career breaks will be considered.
- Applicants must be salaried members of staff (including full and part time, fixed term and continuing, and sessional) of the Faculty of Engineering and Information Technology at the time of nomination.

10.2 Assessment criteria

Nominations should address the following assessment criteria via the application form. Max. 500 words:

- 1. Exemplification of teaching excellence through an innovative approach to student learning and development with a sound rationale
- 2. Demonstrated impact and value created for the student(s) through this approach.
- 3. Demonstrated scholarly activities that you have undertaken that have influenced and enhanced teaching. This may include: showing advanced skills in evaluation and reflective practice; participating in and contributing to professional activities related to learning and teaching; coordination, management and leadership of courses and student learning; conducting and publishing research related to teaching; demonstrating leadership through activities that have broad influence on colleagues and/or the profession.

Outstanding achievements may include leading innovations in pedagogy and curriculum redesign, development of curricula and resources , feedback or assessment , and student citizenship and cohort building initiatives.

One award is awarded annually. Subject to eligibility, Award winners are expected to nominate for at least one other award in an alternate scheme the year following their successful FEIT Excellence Award nomination.

11.1 Eligibility criteria

- Individual nominations only are accepted for this award.
- Applicants must be Mid-Career Academics with five to ten years' experience teaching in higher education institutions. This duration is calculated from the point of employment; career breaks will be considered.
- Applicants must be salaried members of staff (including full and part time, fixed term and continuing, and sessional) of the Faculty of Engineering and Information Technology at the time of nomination.

11.2 Assessment criteria

Nominations should address the following assessment criteria via the application form. Max. 500 words:

- 1. Exemplification of leading teaching excellence through an innovative approach to teaching with a sound rationale
- 2. Demonstrated impact and value created for the student(s) through this approach

- Applicants must be a Tutor or Demonstrator employed by the Faculty of Engineering and Information Technology.
- Applicants must be a salaried member of staff (including full and part time, fixed term and continuing, and casual) of the Faculty of Engineering and Information Technology at the time of nomination.

12.2 Assessment criteria

Nominations should address the following assessment criteria via the application form. Max. 500 words:

- 1. Demonstrated impact and value created for the student(s)
- Demonstrated evidence-based activities that you have undertaken within the expected responsibilities of a tutor or demonstrator at the University of Melbourne. These activities may include tutoring, demonstrating and marking.



- Applicants must be salaried members of professional staff (including full and part time, fixed term and continuing)
 of the University of Melbourne at the time of nomination (honorary staff are ineligible).

Nominations should address the following assessment criteria via the application form. Max. 500 words:

- Demonstrated innovative approach.
 How has the applicant(s) demonstrated innovation in their approach to work.
